### White Park marker-proposal:


As I mentioned at the meeting, one of the things I'd like to see left behind from each BHW...besides a good time and bringing local history to the <u>folks</u>, is a physical memory. In the previous <u>years</u> we have managed to leave behind several plaques, and some great booklets. When we started looking at the historic markers around town, we found that most were put up in the teens and 20's, some in the 50's, then for the Centennial 18 were planned <u>and produced</u>, but none was installed until a few years later! More were installed around 2008 and 4 remain in a box at the museum. That was a huge gap in production from 1971 to about 2014... 40 some years is a big gap!


Since the 2018 BHW is a river theme, and I see the Mississippi Riverfront Project are once again big news in the paper (Jan. 1 Dispatch), it would be great to strive for another river marker or 2. There are 2 Graphic Markers on the river now, one just below the High Rise depicting the "Father of Brainerd", Lyman P. White (LPW), and one a bit farther south depicting the Steamboat Landing. The former marker location was chosen because that triangle of land called the West End Addition to Brainerd that is being proposed as the Riverside Plaza\* is land given to Brainerd in 1921 by LPW's son, Almond White for use as a park. It was then called White Park for use a permanent Camp Site, and was later used as a motor/automobile Tourist Park in the 1920's. Currently, the LPW plaque touts the accomplishments of LPW, but nothing about the connection between he and his son and the land. The land was last co-owned by the city and school district, but I think it has now become city property.

\*(As for the Mississippi Riverfront Project, it will look to build a riverside plaza on what is currently a parking lot just south of Northstar Apartments, Bergman noted.)






### LYMAN P. WHITE



Lyman P. White came to Brainerd via stagecoach from St. Chool in 1870 at 1956 (4), already successful as a Vermone legislator and railroader. White was an agent for the Lake Superior and Phige Sound I and Company, which specialized in planting nowns and selling hots for the Northern Pacific Railroad. He was often called the Father of Brainerd for his role in starring the town. He had sawmild on the river hank south of the tracks and a small planting mill on South Fifth Street. White bailt the first frame house in town, was the first city council president and second mayor. He sheped organise the First National Bank, first school district, and the Episcopal Church. White did in 1902 at the age of 91 and is buried in Evergreen Cemeteery.



R: 1949 BCD


Notice that Tourist Park is the bottom triangle, and the later Wright (Judd Wright?) Park is the lot on Water St. AND the river north of the triangle. This is the only place I see any "Wright Park" (1949, the only map showing a Wright Park, other than the 1949 BCD refrence to the Wright Park Cabins). Looking at the 2 maps above, it would seem that Wright Park and Tourist Park were 2 different locations.








    - Which will become a part of the Cuyuna Lakes State Trail












## PAUL BUNYAN TRAIL









    - which provides food, lodging, shopping, and multiple transportation amenities








